

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

NAGA SAI AND ASHA CONTINUE TO WALK AS THEY ROUND THE CORNER ...





In the pursuit of breaking monotony, should architects always aim to push the boundaries and create something entirely new, or do small changes within existing norms bring the same impact? Should this innovation be utilitarian or on the other hand more radical that might not be immediately practical or functional but are guided by a vision of an improved and idealized state of being?

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Do these examples primarily break the monotony on a contextual or urban scale by standing out differently, or do they have the potential to stand alone as extraordinary structures in any setting? How can we extrapolate their original success to different cities and cultures?

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Is the desire to break the monotony in architecture inherently tied to the human need for newness and surprise, or can it also be seen as a response to the increasing homogenization of urban landscapes? Are we witnessing a new era of architectural diversity and experimentation, or is this a temporary deviation from the norm?

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
